JONATHON DAVID McGUFFIN- Pictured
in his Confederate gray uniform, Jonathon David
McGuffin was the oldest child and only son of John
David McGuffin and Nancy Cook. Jonathon David
McGuffin was the first McGuffin of our line to be born
in America (his father, John David McGuffin,
immigrated from Ireland prior to 1830, as Jonathon
was born that year in Virginia). Although Jonathon
David McGuffin survived Civil War hostilities, he
was murdered for his horse as he was returning from
the war about 12 miles from home. At the time of his
death, he was about 35 years old. He left a wife,
Ellen Tellena Self, and five children, four boys and
one girl. Spelling of Jonathon could possibly be
Jonathan; various handwritten documents could be
interpreted as either spelling. (Original photo from
