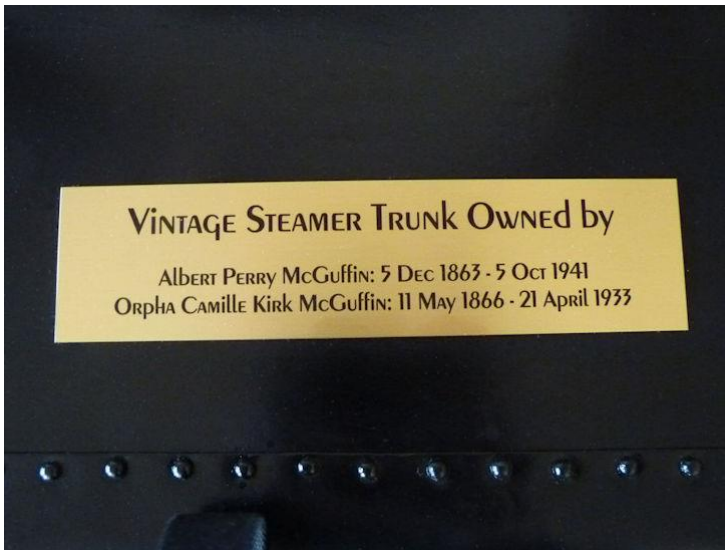


Shown below are pictures of a Vintage Steamer Trunk owned by Albert and Orpha McGuffin in the late 1800 – early 1900's. It was passed down through the family and kept in storage for many years.
